Unison: "Glory to God in the highest heaven!"

THE PEACE

One: The peace of Christ be with you.

All: And also with you.

(From your seat, a brief sign of peace may be shared: a wave of the hand, a nod of the head, etc.)

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH: The Christ Candle

One: The first candle tells us that

"The hopes and fears of all the years

Are met in him tonight."

("O Little Town of Bethlehem")

All: The second candle reminds us of the song of the angels:

"Peace on earth, good will to all."

(Luke 2:14)

One: The third candle signals this

"good news of a great joy for all the people."

(Luke 2:10)

All: The fourth candle helps us remember that,

"To show God's love aright Mary bore for us a Savior, When half spent was the night."

("Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming")

One: And the candle in the middle of it all proclaims that it is Jesus Christ -- he whose birth we now celebrate -- who is the fulfillment of our hope; it is Jesus Christ who is our peace; it is Jesus Christ who brings us joy; it is Jesus Christ who is the embodiment of God's love.

Let us pray.

Unison: We thank you, O God, for this wondrous gift of Christ. As we celebrate his birth, may he be all to us that you intend him to be. And may we proclaim him our Lord and Savior, and give him our all. In his name we pray. Amen.
