Message from Pastor Bill Vincent

We work some. We vacation some. We play some. We sleep some. We come. We go. All part of the rhythm of life.

The writer of Ecclesiastes speaks of this rhythm:

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven:

a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance;



a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to throw away; a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace. (Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 NRSV)

We plant the seed and wait for it to grow, all the while caring for it and tending to it. Then we reap the harvest, however good or not-so-good the harvest may be.

We work through the day and sleep at night...most of us do, anyhow.

Summer follows Spring and is in turn followed by Fall and Winter...and then Spring again, both with the seasons of the year and the seasons of our life.

All part of the rhythm and flow of life.

When we get out of sync with the rhythm, things generally get messed up. We're not alert when we need to be. We're too tired to work and play. We're too wound up to sleep. We speak when we should be silent. We're silent when we should speak. The pieces of life don't seem to fit.

God works in a rhythm, too: working through the rhythm of life to nurture and sustain us; working through the rhythm to guide us and direct us, to teach us and speak to us.

God's rhythm is not always the same as the ones identified in Ecclesiastes. Sometimes, God has a rhythm of God's very own.

Here, too, if we get out of sync with God's rhythm, things can get all messed up. We can even find ourselves opposing God (see, for example, Gamaliel's speech in Acts 5:33-39).

Often being out of sync with God's rhythm means we're impatient, wanting God to act now (and I do mean Now!) instead of when God decides to act. Then it is that we can take comfort in, and possibly accept a moderate admonishment from, words out of the book of Isaiah, that

...those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint. (Isaiah 40:31 NRSV)

But remember: we've got to wait for the Lord. We've got to be in sync with God's rhythm.

We can best stay attuned to God's rhythm through faithful worship and prayer, through study of the Bible and conversation with others, and through consciously being open to God's movement in our midst.

I hope that you will be attuned to the rhythm of life in general, and your own rhythm in particular. But especially, I hope and pray that you will be in sync with the rhythm of God at work in your life and in the world.
